	Q2. Are there currently any plans to revise your Community Remedy document? Q3. How have you publicised the Community Remedy to the general public?	Northumbria Police and the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner for Northumbria are collaborating on expanding the scope of the use of 'Out of Court Disposals'. A principal part of this is the Community Remedy. There is particular attention being paid to the use of Community Resolution and Conditional Cautions. We are actively researching opportunities to expand the options available to victims of crime in this area. This work has only just commenced (early October) and is planned to develop over the next 12 months.
		Q2. Are there currently any plans to revise your Community Remedy document?
		As above, this is under active review.
		Q3. How have you publicised the Community Remedy to the general public?
		The Community Remedy policy adopted by Northumbria Police is based upon the national agreed approach. The approach is based on

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		national documents which are available via official law enforcement and government policy websites (Crown Prosecution Service and Gov.uk) Additionally, we have referred to the Community Remedy on the Northumbria Police website. This gives information on how this is an option available to the victims of anti-social behaviour.
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
