The current programmes connected to domestic abuse focus on the behaviour of the perpetrator and often mean the women relive traumatic experiences, so the focus of the new programme "Just Me" is around aspirations and to help them find themselves again. Women's Health Advice Centre, SE Northumberland – The funding will go towards the costs of supporting women who are coming into the Centre in crisis. They are averaging two women a week who need immediate support for issues arising from domestic/sexual violence, housing and finance; often all three. This is a noticeable increase as previously women presenting in crisis were occasional and not the norm for the organisation. They have no funding for this work, so the cost is being met from reserves/core funding.		Community confidence
Safe Places Monitoring Post	Your Voice Counts and Talk 2 us launched the Safe Places initiative in South Tyneside in October 2013. The Safe Places scheme helps people with learning disabilities deal with any incident that takes place while they are out. The idea is, if for whatever reason a person becomes distressed, they would look for a designated Safe Place, which would be identified by a Safe Places sticker.	£2,500	 Putting victims first Community Confidence
