Terms of Reference

Role and Purpose

- The Police & Crime Commissioners Faith/BME Advisory Group (the 'Advisory Group') will provide a systematic means for strategic dialogue between Faith/BME organisations and the Office of the Police & Crime Commissioner (the "OPCC") and will be chaired by the Police & Crime Commissioner.
- 2. To fulfil this role the Advisory Group will:
 - Help to shape how the OPCC works with the sector to strengthen its role in future policy development, delivery and relationship with Northumbria Police;
 - o agree a work programme to inform and promote its activities;
 - provide a conduit for two way communication including key messages, feedback on policy impacts and enablers and barriers to delivery.
 - highlight issues affecting the community that relate to or affect Northumbria Police.
 - respond to current strategic challenges and opportunities, including issues relating to policies for vulnerable groups, and
 - promote the role of the advisory group in community activism and volunteering.

Meetings

3. The Faith/BME Advisory Group will meet three times a year. Additional ad-hoc meetings may be called to undertake more detailed work on key issues in advance of main meetings.
