The PCCs Scrutiny Programme includes a bi annual report on custody provision. This report is exempt from publication as it contains information relating to individuals. It provides the PCC with information about the effectiveness of police custody services in Northumbria in accordance with the criteria used by HMICFRS and HM Prisons Inspectorate to assess custody arrangements. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Leadership, accountability and partnerships</li> <li>• Pre-custody; first point of contact</li> <li>• In the custody suite; booking in, individual needs and legal rights</li> <li>• In the custody cell, safeguarding and health care</li> <li>• Release and transfer from custody</li> </ul> At present 99% of attendance/response rates for healthcare interventions are within one hour. All interventions are recorded, reviewed by the custody inspector and are subject to scrutiny by Professional Standards department and the report provides a breakdown of this information. In the last five full calendar years, 2015-2019, and 2020 to date there have been the following deaths in custody. <p>2015 - 1 2016 - 1 2017 - 0 2018 - 0 2019 - 2 – both were transported to hospital where they later died. 2020 - 0</p>	21.4.21
