Adversity Awareness - £21,303

Development and delivery of accredited training/resources for partner organisations across Northumbria.

Strengthening Partnerships - £365,219.50

This intervention aims, in the first instance, to build on the existing relationship between the Northumbria VRU and the 6 Community Safety Partnerships through the co-development of violence reduction interventions.

REDUCE OFFENDING

Intervention Titles:

- 1. Working together to reduce re-offending
- 2. Out of Court Disposals
- 3. Violence Reduction Link Workers

Working together to reduce re-offending - £92,500

This intervention uses an Integrated Offender Management (IOM) problem solving approach to reduce re-offending and increase successful engagement with other support services.

Two projects will be allocated funding to deliver this intervention:

- Junction 42 £80,000
- Northumbria Police £12,500 (For an OOCD Coordinator post)

Out of Court Disposals - £46,879

OOCD seeks to engage people at the earliest opportunity as they enter the criminal justice system to deliver Conditional Cautioning disposals with the aim of diverting individuals away from the criminal justice system and reduce re-offending.

Two projects will be allocated funding to deliver this intervention:

- Changing Lives £15,000
- Northumbria Police £31,879

Violence Reduction Link Workers - £59,808

Delivery of bespoke interventions, delivered in the community, to young people who are, or are at risk of becoming, involved in violence. Two projects will be allocated funding to deliver this intervention:

- Edbert's House £29,752
- First Contact Clinical £30,056

WORKING WITH FAMILIES

Intervention Titles:

- 1. Thrive in Beacon Lough East
- 2. Southwick Hub
- 3. Family Entrepreneurs

Thrive in Beacon Lough East - £61,748

An early years intervention, working with families where there are identified 'risk factors' likely to influence the new born children's development in a negative way.

Southwick Hub - £45,548

Provision of a Community Development worker, employed by Sunderland City Council, to build community confidence with a range of local authority and voluntary sector providers.

Family Gateway - £56,500

An intervention aimed at empowering families, experiencing deprivation, to become resilient and move forward in their lives, building safe and stable home and community environments and breaking inter-generational cycles and reducing gaps in attainment and opportunity for children and young people.

YOUTH DIVERSION

Intervention Titles:

- 1. YOLO Programme
- 2. School Liaison Officers

YOLO Programme - £114,500

A Northumbria wide targeted youth diversion programme aimed at young people who are at risk of being drawn into knife crime, serious violence and other forms of vulnerability. This is a joint programme between Foundation of Light, Newcastle United Foundation & Northumbria Police, which funding split as follows:

- Foundation of Light £58,000
- Newcastle United Foundation £44,000
- Northumbria Police £12,500

School Liaison Officers - £115,854

Delivery of a range of bespoke violence reduction education programmes by a dedicated team of liaison officers, employed by Northumbria Police.
