Edge  <b>Gateshead and North Tyneside</b>	10,000	120	Specialist youth organisation providing mentoring, mobile music and outreach work. Funding will enable the service to deploy an additional mentor into North Tyneside, this has been recognised as a need from Northumbria police central harm reduction inspector Kelly Hetherington, the service will also deliver the REAL project in North Tyneside areas where there are limited Youth outreach projects at present.
Throckley Community Hall  <b>Newcastle</b>	11,768	948	Throckley Community Hall delivers a wide range of social, recreational and educational activities to the local community. With funding from the WCF they will deliver a vital service for young people and the communities to reduce crime, ASB, prevent, change mindsets, and get NEET young people back into education/alternative education or employment. The organisation have requested funding to provide 4 interventions:- Detached Outreach, mentoring, girl's youth sessions, fitness sessions.
Auxillia Youth  <b>South Tyneside</b>	6,680	30+	Auxillia Youth Services CIC was set up as a social enterprise and is operating across South Tyneside with the aim of providing young people with a bespoke youth service, that offers 1 to 1 support and mentoring to help overcome barriers to education, employment and training whilst remaining fully flexible to meet the needs of the young person. Building on the existing 'Straight outta Bilton Youth Project' they would like to deploy outreach youth workers to get young people involved in more outdoor social action projects.
Bad Apples  <b>Northumberland (Ashington, Bedlington, Morpeth and Cramlington) Evenings Weekends working</b>	9,860	150+	Bad Apples North East deliver music dance and art projects and diversionary activities for Children and Young People in South East Northumberland. Using a mix of projects/activities back loaded with youth work practice and education they offer young people the opportunity to gain skills and qualifications in things they enjoy by building evidence and a portfolio of experience and using the Arts Awards and Youth Achievement Awards frameworks  Funding will enable detached youth workers to be deployed on the ground on a Thursday, Friday and Saturday evening in areas with increased levels of ASB and they will further engage young people with offered online learning and activities within the centre. The predominant focus will be in the Ashington, Bedlington, Morpeth and Cramlington.

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Streetwise  <b>Gateshead and Newcastle</b>	10,428	50+	The main purpose of the charity is to preserve and provide for the physical and mental health of children and young people aged 11 - 25 years, by listening to them and offering a range of specialist services that help them to make informed choices, overcome difficulties and realise their potential. Funding will be used for the salaries of two youth workers who will research/reach out and contact girls and BAME young women identified as being at risk of becoming involved in crime and/or serious violence.
Cowpen Quay  <b>Northumberland (Blyth) Daytime work</b>	4,040	190	Cowpen Quay is the charitable arm of The Buffalo Centre, and they are based in the most deprived ward of Northumberland, Blyth. Much support is needed for young people in this deprived area which has high drugs, alcohol and crime issues. Youth leaders have continued to work with and engage young people from this area using various techniques- online and door to door ensuring young people have an understanding of the new potential risks they face, particularly around exploitation, violence and ABS during these unprecedented times. Many of the young people accessing the service are vulnerable due to poverty, special educational needs and disabilities this is why they need the extra support from staff to ensure their safety. Funding from the WCF will be used for a 10-week programme @ 1 session per week for a daytime detached youth worker to engage with young people who are not engaging with online learning as well as engage with other community members and vulnerable groups. The project will provide information and activity packs to young people and promote engagement with services in the Buffalo Centre and encourage reengagement with online educational learning.
YMCA- Northumberland  <b>Northumberland (Ashington, Newbiggin Lynemouth, Ellington and Linton) Evening and daytime work Monday to Friday</b>	8,440	60	YMCA is an established organisation within Northumberland. Their aim is to serve the needs of young people by providing a space where they can truly belong, contribute and thrive. The YMCA do this through a number of activities and diversionary programmes delivered in Ashington and outreach in other communities in South East Northumberland. The YMCA would like to expand their ability to put a youth team on the streets of Ashington, Newbiggin Lynemouth, Ellington and Linton. Funding will be used to enable additional youth workers to carry out detached work five evenings/days per week.
Silx Teen Bus  <b>Northumberland (Blyth)</b>	5,400	200	The ethos of the organisation is to work with marginalised and deprived young people and provide an offer of a provision that provides them with opportunities and interventions and diverts them

The organisation can offer a variety of provision but at the present time the most effective offer that can be offered to work with vulnerable young people being at risk of being involved with serious violence is via a detached project three evenings a week, mainly focusing on weekend and Friday evening work The Ten-week project will consist of working three evenings a week mainly Friday, Saturday and one other day and will focus on known areas of concern. Including Skate Park, Croft Ward, Centre of Blyth.</p>
<p>NE Youth Alliance (Youth Focus NE and NE Youth)</p> <p><b>Newcastle and Gateshead (any other needed areas)</b></p>	<p>13,420</p>	<p>150</p>	<p>The partnership between Youth Focus North East and NE Youth to deliver this programme is a new one, but it is based on a long history of the two organisations working together. Taking the learning and experiences from the initial lockdown they would like to re-invest in their online work with young people both in terms of a daily presence as universal offer for young people and to deliver further thematic workshops. They would also like to increase their outreach youth provision in existing areas to provide additional support to more at-risk young people. This will assist the distribution of well-being packs. They would also like to increase their outreach youth provision to provide additional support to more young people at risk.</p>
<p>Youth Almighty</p> <p><b>Sunderland</b></p>	<p>4,484</p>	<p>20</p>	<p>Youth Almighty have provided youth provision since 2008 and became a charity in 2010. They work in partnership with young people and the local community to ensure all programs and development of services meet their changing needs. They use this insight to build high-profile partnerships to co-create and deliver innovative, accessible, opportunities for all. Youth Almighty provide a range of services for the whole community: youth provision, junior work, detached and outreach, one 2 one support, NEET work, Community Helper service, sports, issues based, volunteering opportunities, accredited learning, coffee morning, Men's and Women's Group, lunch club, digital Skills, unemployment support, food bank, and stop smoking. With funding from the WCF they will target those young people who are at risk of being drawn into violence and crime. They will to continue to reach out to young people through adapting their delivery using safe and alternative methods</p>
<p>Bright Futures <b>South Tyneside</b></p>	<p>10,000</p>	<p>20</p>	<p>Bright Futures are a registered charity working with young women aged 11-25 to give them a brighter future by raising self-esteem and confidence around a range of issues.</p>

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			During these unprecedented times funding is sought to provide additional support to young women who are vulnerable and at risk of exploitation. Working with Northumbria Police Force the project will be able to engage young women in online activity and detached outreach work.
